1. Pursuant to the provisions of reference (a), Subject hereinafter referred to as Petitioner, filed enclosure (1) with this Board requesting, in effect, that the applicable naval record be corrected to show entitlement to the payment of Lump Sum Leave (LSL).
2. The Board, consisting of Messrs. Dunn, Mathews, and Ms. McCormick, reviewed Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice on 13 April 1999 and, pursuant to its regulations, determined that the corrective action indicated below should be taken on the available evidence of record. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of the enclosures, naval records, and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.
3. The Board, having reviewed all the facts of record pertaining to Petitioner's allegations of error and injustice, finds as follows:
 - a. Before applying to this Board, Petitioner exhausted all administrative remedies available under existing law and regulations within the Department of the Navy.
 - b. In correspondence attached as enclosure (2), the office having cognizance over the subject matter addressed in Petitioner's application has commented to the effect that the request has merit and warrants favorable action.

CONCLUSION

Upon review and consideration of all the evidence of record, and especially in light of the contents of enclosure (2), the Board finds the existence of an injustice warranting the following corrective action.



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RECOMMENDATION:

That Petitioner's naval record be corrected, where appropriate, to show that he incurred a six (6) year service obligation for flight training effective 14 December 1991 with an expiration date of 13 December 1997 and further corrected to show that his Augmentation into the Regular Marine Corps was effective 14 December 1997 vice on 1 July 1998 to establish entitlement to the sale of 60 days of LSL effective 14 December 1997. Since Marines are only eligible to sell LSL when augmentation occurs in conjunction with completion of their initial service obligation this correction will establish LSL entitlement. Further, any leave lost on 1 October 1998 is to be reinstated.

a. That a copy of this Report of Proceedings be filed in Petitioner's naval record.

4. Pursuant to Section 6(c) of the revised Procedures of the Board for Correction of Naval Records (32 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 723.6(c)) it is certified that quorum was present at the Board's review and deliberations, and that the foregoing is a true and complete record of the Board's proceedings in the above entitled matter.
