The applicant, while serving in the grade of senior Airman, was [redacted] from the Air Force on 21 J 96 under the provisions of AFI 36- [redacted] (Misconduct) and received an [redacted] honorable conditions (general) [redacted] charge. She had served 03 years, 10 months and 25 days active ser [redacted] Applicant appeared before [redacted] Air Force Discharge Review [redacted] on 30 Apr 98 and the board upgraded applicant's [redacted] charge to [redacted] [redacted] and her reason for separation to [redacted] Authority with a [redacted] program designator of JFF and reentry code of 2C.

Requested Action. The applicant is now requesting her reentry code and separation program designator codes be corrected for reserve status/or reinstatement to active duty to fulfill 2nd term obligation.

Conclusion and Recommendation. Since the Discharge Review Board concluded that the discharge she received was not consistent with the procedural and substantive requirements of the discharge regulation that the applicant was not provided full administrative due process, this office would have no objection if AFBCMR grants applicant's request for reinstatement to active duty. In addition, applicant had a sterling performance record prior to assignment where she was discharged and makes a good candidate for continued active service in the Air Force. She has filed a timely request.

SUBJECT: Application for Correction of Record - [REDACTED]

The applicant requests her Reenlistment Eligibility (RE) code be changed to a favorable code to permit reinstatement. The applicant filed a timely request within three years of discovering alleged injustice.

The applicant was discharged on **21 Jun 96** after serving four years and **24** days active and inactive service. She initially received an RE code of "2B: Involuntarily separated with a general or under-other-than-honorable discharge," However, the Discharge Review Board (DRB) changed her reason for discharge to "Secretarial Authority," and her character of service to honorable. As a result, her RE code was changed to "2C: Involuntarily separated with an honorable discharge."

In reviewing applicant's military records and the DRB's conclusion that there is evidence of impropriety in her discharge, we recommend RE code "2C" be changed to "**3K**: Reserved for use by HQ AFPC or the Air Force Board for Correction of Military Records (AFBCMR) when no other reenlistment eligibility code applies or is appropriate." This will permit reinstatement, provided all other conditions for reinstatement are met.

If reinstated, applicant will not require a constructive reenlistment, since her four-year, 1 D 95 reenlistment has not yet expired [REDACTED]

SUBJECT: Letter of Notification

1. I am recommending your discharge from the United States Air Force for a pattern of misconduct **consisting** of **minor disciplinary infractions**, according to AFI 36-3208, under the provisions of paragraph 5.49. If **my** recommendation is approved, your service will be characterized as honorable or **general**. I am recommending that your **service** be characterized as **general**.

2. **My** reason for the action **is** your engagement in a pattern of misconduct **consisting** of minor disciplinary infractions. Specifically:

a. On **14 December 1995**, you received a Record of **Counseling (Atch 1-1)** for **dereliction** of duty. The Record of **Counseling was** placed in a Unfavorable Information File.

b. On **9 January 1996** you received a **Letter** of Reprimand (Atch 1-2) for **failing to obey** a lawful order.

c. On **31 January 1996**, you received a **Letter** of Reprimand (Atch 1-3) for dereliction of duty. The Letter of Reprimand **was** placed in a Unfavorable Information File.

d. On **25 March 1996**, you received a Record of **Counseling (Atch 1-4)** for dereliction of duty.

e. On **8 April 1996**, you received a **Letter** of Reprimand (Atch 1-5) for dereliction of duty.

f. On **10 April 1996**, you received a Record of **Counseling (Atch 1-6)** for **failing to go to** your appointed place of duty **at** the prescribed time.

g. On **15 April 1996**, you received a **Letter** of Admonishment (Atch 1-7) for **failing to go** to your appointed place of duty at the prescribed time. The Letter of Admonishment **was** placed in your already existing Unfavorable Information File.

h. On **6 May 1996**, you received a Letter of Reprimand (Atch 1-8) for failing to complete an assigned duty in a timely manner.

Copies of the documents to be forwarded to the separation authority in support of the recommendation are attached. The Commander exercising SPCM ~~jurisdiction or a higher~~ authority will decide whether you will be discharged or retained in the Air Force; If you are discharged, you **will be** ineligible for re-enlistment in the Air Force.

3. You have the right to consult counsel. ~~Military~~ legal counsel has been obtained to assist you. I have made an appointment for you to consult Capt [REDACTED] at Bldg 1005, DSN [REDACTED], on 28 MAY 96 at 0900 hours in his office. You may consult civilian counsel at your own expense.

4. Any statements you want the separation authority to consider must reach me within 3 workdays unless you request and receive an extension for good cause shown. I will send them to the separation authority.

5. If you fail to consult counsel or to submit statements in your own behalf, your failure will constitute a waiver of your right to do so.

6. You have been scheduled for a physical examination. You must report to the NCOIC, Physical Examinations, building 1309, on 29 MAY 96 at 0900 hours.

7. You have been scheduled for a preliminary appointment with the 325 MSS Relocations Section. You must report to building 662, room 216 on 30 MAY 96 at 1030 hours.

8. Any personal information you furnish in rebuttal is covered by the Privacy Act of 1974. A copy of AF I 36-3208 is available for your use in the orderly room.

9. Execute the attached acknowledgment and return it to me immediately.
