This is in reference to your application for correction of your naval record pursuant to the provisions of Title 10 of the United States Code section 1552.

A three-member panel of the Board for Correction of Naval Records, sitting in executive session, considered your application on 27 August 2003. Your allegations of error and injustice were reviewed in accordance with administrative regulations and procedures applicable to the proceedings of this Board. Documentary material considered by the Board consisted of your application, together with all material submitted in support thereof, your naval record and applicable statutes, regulations and policies.

After careful and conscientious consideration of the entire record, the Board found that the evidence submitted was insufficient to establish the existence of probable material error or injustice.

The Board found that you enlisted in the Navy on 16 November 1984 at age 18. You served without incident until 4 April 1985, when you received nonjudicial punishment (NJP) for being drunk and disorderly, and were awarded a reduction to paygrade E-1 and restriction. On 24 June 1987, you were convicted of a second NJP for use of marijuana and PCP, and were awarded restriction, extra duty, reduction to paygrade E-2, and forfeitures of pay.

Although not in the record, it appears that you waived all of your procedural rights when notified of administrative separation processing. On 21 July 1987, the separation authority directed an other than honorable separation by reason of misconduct due to drug abuse. On 27 July 1987, you were so discharged and assigned a reenlistment code of RE-4.
